Summary of program

- Our Mentoring program matches trained volunteer mentors with families struggling to overcome the bonds of poverty, homelessness and reentry after incarceration.
- Family Pathfinders trains volunteers from churches, community organizations or corporations to mentor families for one year who are struggling to become financially stable.
- Mentors join hands with the family, helping them make the very difficult transition to financial stability. Each mentor provides a broad range of support including budgeting, job preparation, decision making, emotional support, parenting and goal setting.
- A volunteer time commitment of 3-4 hours/month can release a family from the cycle of poverty, and the ripple effect of that transformation will not only strengthen that one family, but also future generations.
- Our 85% rate of retained employment confirms that this unique program makes a difference in people's lives when they learn life skills from caring, committed volunteers.
- The program has been recognized for Best Practices by Urban Partnership Initiatives of the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services.
